## Voter ID Bills Signed

**McDonnell directs state to send every voter a new voter card before Election Day.**

**G**overnor Robert McDonnell (R) signed watered-down versions of Virginia's Republican-backed voter identification bills on Friday, adding the Commonwealth to the growing list of states adopting stricter voting standards.

Under the new law, voters will be required to show ID before they cast their ballots, a measure that Democrats in the Virginia General Assembly have said will disenfranchise many voters, especially minorities, the poor and the elderly.

To subdue critics, the Governor signed measures expanding the type of ID acceptable at the polls — which include a utility bill or a Virginia student ID card — and directed the State Board of Elections to send every registered voter a new card before the 2012 presidential elections in November.

"Every qualified citizen has the right to cast one vote. Not two votes; not zero votes," McDonnell said in a statement released Friday. "This legislation does two things. It increases the forms of identification that can be used for purpose of voting, while helping to further prevent voter fraud and ensuring Virginians that they can have faith that votes have not been fraudulently cast."

**THE PREVALENCE** — or absence — of voter fraud is at the heart of the debate over whether Virginia or other states need any new legislation.

"The 'voter identification' bills are a solution in search of a problem," said State Sen. Chap Petersen (D-34) in an email on Saturday. "Our current system is working fine. By agreeing to these gratuitous changes, the Governor is making the system less open and convenient to law-abiding citizens."

State Sen. David Marsden (D-37) has said that using voter fraud as a justification for new voter identification rules is a smokescreen for voter suppression. "When we've asked these legislators (in Virginia) to cite one example of voter fraud, they just can't do it," Marsden said.

Even McDonnell noted Virginia's "tradition of honest elections" and a voter compliance rate of nearly 100 percent in a survey of localities from the last presidential and gubernatorial elections in 2008 and 2009.

Currently, Virginia voters are allowed to vote without ID by signing a sworn affidavit affirming their identity. Under the new law, voters without ID cards will still be able to vote provisionally, on the condi-

### Acceptable Forms of ID

Under the new legislation and existing law, the following are acceptable forms of ID for voting:

- ❖ Virginia voter registration card
- ❖ Social Security card
- ❖ Valid Virginia driver's license
- ❖ Any other identification card issued by an agency of the Commonwealth, one of its political subdivisions, or the United States
- ❖ Any valid student identification card issued by a Virginia institution of higher education
- ❖ A valid identification card issued by an employer containing a photograph of the voter
- ❖ A copy of a current utility bill
- ❖ A copy of a bank statement
- ❖ A government check
- ❖ A paycheck that shows the name and address of the voter

tion they provide proper ID later for the vote to be counted.

"Some have argued that there are voters who do not have any form of ID to bring to the polls. For that reason, we will be sending every voter in Virginia a free voter card between now and Election Day to ensure they have at least one form of ID to bring with them to the polls," McDonnell said.

In addition to issuing every active voter a new card, McDonnell also ordered election officials to coordinate a public education campaign to help raise awareness about the approved ID to the polling place on Election Day, and the process for obtaining a free voter card if someone does not have a form of ID.

McDonnell said the additional steps his administration is taking to implement this legislation ensure that no voter is "overly burdened by the provisions included in this legislation."

According to the National Conference of State Legislatures, a bipartisan research organization, Voter ID continues to be a high-profile and highly-contentious issue in many state legislatures. Currently, 32 states have voter ID legislation pending, and several states have pushed for rigorous laws that require voters to present a state-issued photo ID card.

**JUST BEFORE** McDonnell's pronouncement, the Fairfax County Office of Elections launched a campaign to alert voters to new voter registration cards the state is in the process of mailing to approximately 195,000 county voters this week.

But the cards are being mailed only to voters affected by Congressional redistricting and voters still holding a

This last performance had an almost full house, and received a standing ovation. President David Goode presented a gift to Hegerich and flowers to the soloists.

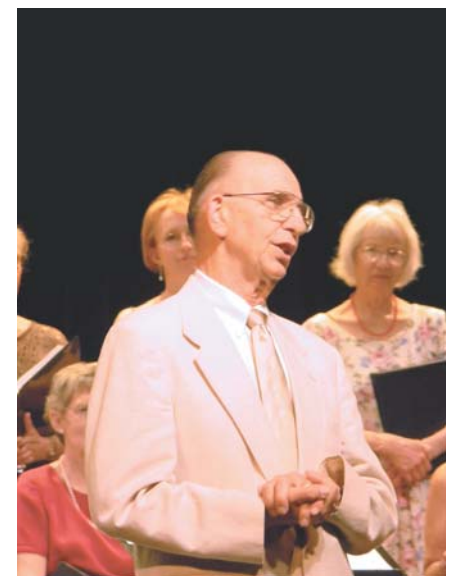

# Big Wheels Rolling Again!

**Burke Lake  
Train celebrates  
improvements to  
train and track.**

**L**ittle engineers jumped aboard Fairfax County's first miniature Central Pacific Huntington steam engine as it chugged over the tracks at Burke Lake Park, carrying guests on a quick loop around the park to celebrate improvements to the train and tracks.

On Sunday, May 20, a new version of the one-third-scale replica C.P. Huntington started making the rounds after the little engine that could was temporarily retired in 2005.

"This train has been a popular ride for nearly 40 years," said Supervisor Pat Herrity (R-Springfield), who greeted guests during the celebration and boarded the train for its inaugural ride.

"I remember riding my bike here when I was a kid, through what's now Burke Lake Center. We were adventurers," Herrity said. "Generations of families come here every year. It's one of our most popular parks."

The new locomotive looks the same, but new technology has made the ride advances in the design of miniature trains. According to Charlie Reagle, Burke Lake Park Manager, this model gets diagnostic tests performed by laptop computer, it's quieter and the improved gas mileage is a driver's dream - 26 runs, almost continu-

card that included their Social Security Number (SSN), which will be replaced with a system-generated identification number.

Now, every registered voter will get at least one new voter card. The cards mailed out this week also indicate a language preference.

According to Cameron Quinn, Fairfax County's chief elections official, as a result of the 2010 Census, Fairfax County falls under Section 203 of the Voting Rights Act, which requires the county to provide voting and elections-related materials in English and Spanish.

She said Fairfax County is now providing voter information and materials for Spanish speakers. And the county's website [www.fairfaxcounty.gov/elections](http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/elections) has a Google Translations line that can translate information into Spanish and several other languages.

Quinn said that while the Fairfax County and state websites are up-

dated, not all voter election web pages and links have been updated with the new congressional district information.

"Those voters whose congressional district changed as a result of redistricting are currently being mailed a new voter card," Quinn said. "Whether or not you received a new voter card, if you have questions or to be certain you know your congressional district information, refer to the county or state election office's website for the correct information or call us at 703-222-0776."

# Remembering on Memorial Day

**Time to honor, also time to ensure proper care of veterans.**

In February, Brig. Gen. Terence J. Hildner, 49, of Fairfax, was the highest ranking military officer to die in the war on terror. Hildner died Feb. 3, 2012 in Kabul province, Afghanistan.

On Memorial Day, we remember all of those who have died in military service, more than 400,000 in World War II, more than 30,000 in Korea, more than 50,000 in Vietnam.

Since Sept. 11, 2001, more than 6,400 U.S. military service men and women have died in support of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. In 2012, there is just one reported death in Iraq, and more than 115 in Afghanistan.

Nearly 50,000 U.S. Military service members have been wounded in the war on terror, although that number is likely to be revised upward. The New York Times reported earlier this month that the military confirmed traumatic brain injury in more than 220,000 of the 2.3 million troops who have served in Iraq and Afghanistan.

The long-term consequences of many of these injuries are unknown, but they will require a national commitment to excellence in health care for both active duty military personnel and veterans.

On Memorial Day, we honor and thank all those who have served in the military, in times of war and peace. It is also a time to reinvigorate efforts to provide the best services and opportunities to our veterans. The Post-9/11 GI Bill dramatically increases the educational benefits extended to members of the military who have served at least three months of active duty since Sept. 11, 2001. Steps to provide better, faster and more responsive health care to veterans, including mental health care are underway, but have a long way to go. This is one place where we must commit the resources to do better.

More than 175 U.S. Military service personnel from Virginia have been killed in Iraq and Afghanistan, including several in the last year.

Aaron Carson Vaughn, 30, was one of 30 American service members and 22 Navy SEALs killed Aug. 6, 2011 when their Chinook helicopter was shot down in Afghanistan. Vaughn's family has ties to McLean and Burke. He is survived by his wife, Kimberly, and their two children.

Spc. Douglas Jay Green, 23 of Sterling, died Aug. 28, 2011. when insurgents attacked his unit using a roadside bomb in Kandahar province, Afghanistan. Green enlisted in 2007, after attending Potomac Falls High School.

Other Virginia losses since Memorial Day 2011:

Capt. Jesse A. Ozbat, 28 of Prince George, Va., died earlier this month on May 20, 2012 in Afghanistan when enemy forces attacked his unit with a roadside bomb.

Constructionman Trevor J. Stanley, 22, of

Spc. Levi Efrain Nuncio, 24 of Harrisonburg, died June 22, 2011 when enemy forces attacked his unit with small-arms fire in the Narang district of Kunar province, Afghanistan.

Capt. Michael Wray Newton, 30 of Newport News, died June 11, 2011 in Meymaneh, Faryab province, Afghanistan.

**HERE ARE** the names of other local men and women who have died in Iraq and Afghanistan and in support of the "war on terror." We repeat these names at least twice a year on Memorial Day and Veterans Day to honor their service and to keep their memories in our consciousness.

Capt. Charles A. Ransom, 31, of Midlothian was one of eight airmen who died April 27, 2011, at the Kabul International Airport, Afghanistan, from gunfire. Sgt. Sean T. Callahan, 23, of Warrenton was one of two Marines who died April 23, 2011 in combat in Helmand, Afghanistan:

Sgt. 1st Class Anthony Venetz Jr., 30, of Prince William died Jan. 28, 2011 in Afghanistan, in a non-combat incident. Venetz had been seriously wounded months before.

Spc. Sean R. Cutsforth, 22, of Radford, Va., died Dec. 15, 2010 in Afghanistan, when insurgents attacked his unit using small arms fire. Spc. William K. Middleton, 26, of Norfolk, was one of two soldiers who died Nov. 22, 2010 in Afghanistan, when insurgents attacked with an improvised explosive device. Staff Sgt. Christopher F. Cabacoy, 30, of Virginia Beach, was

one of two soldiers who died July 5, 2010, in Kandahar, Afghanistan, when insurgents attacked their vehicle with a roadside bomb.

Pfc. Benjamin J. Park, 25, of Fairfax Station, Va., died June 18, 2010 at Zhari district, Kandahar, Afghanistan, of injuries sustained when insurgents attacked his unit with an improvised explosive device.

May 12, 2010, Donald J. Lamar II, 23 of Fredericksburg, was killed in Afghanistan. Christopher D. Worrell, 35 of Virginia Beach, was killed in Iraq on April 22, 2010. Steven J. Bishop, 29 of Christianburg, was killed March 13, 2010 in Iraq. Kielin T. Dunn, 19 of Chesapeake, was killed Feb. 18, 2010 in Afghanistan. Brandon T. Islip, 23 of Richmond, was killed Nov. 29, 2009, in Afghanistan. Stephan L. Mace, 21 of Lovettsville, died Oct. 3, 2009 in Afghanistan.

Bill Cahir, 40 of Alexandria, died Aug. 13, 2009 of a gunshot wound while conducting combat operations in the Helmand Province of Afghanistan. After 9/11, Cahir decided to leave his career as a journalist and join the Marine Corps. After his application to become a Marine had originally been denied because of his age, he lobbied members of Congress to get a special exemption.

Fairfax Station resident Pfc. Dillon Jutras, 20, was killed in combat operations in Al Anbar Province of Iraq Oct. 29, 2005.

Lance Cpl. Daniel Ryan Bennett, 23 of Clifton died Jan. 11, 2009, in Helmand province, Afghanistan. "He loved his country, and we're so proud of him," said his mother.

2nd Lt. Sean P. O'Connor of Burke died Oct. 19, 2008 while stationed at Hunter Army Air Field, Savannah, Ga. O'Connor was an athlete in soccer, baseball and football who attended Fairfax County Public Schools and was a 1999 graduate of Bishop Denis J. O'Connell High School in Arlington.

Pfc. David Sharrett II, 27 of Oakton, died Jan. 16, 2008 in Iraq. On Oct. 24, 2008, his father, David H. Sharrett, was on hand as the Oakton Post Office on White Granite Drive was renamed to honor his son. But the senior Sharrett has battled to learn the truth about his son's death, that he was killed by his lieutenant in the confusion of a firefight. Just last month, April, 2012, Sharrett Sr. obtained documents confirming some of the details of his son's death and a subsequent cover-up, according to Tom Jackman of the Washington Post.

Army 1st Lt. Thomas J. Brown, a George Mason University graduate and Burke resident, died on Sept. 23, 2008, while serving in Iraq. His unit came under small arms fire, and Brown, 26, died from his wounds.

Sgt. Scott Kirkpatrick, 26, died on Aug. 11, 2007, in Arab Jabour, Iraq. Kirkpatrick, who graduated from Park View High School in Sterling, and also considered Herndon and Reston as his hometowns, was a champion slam poet. His father, Ed Kirkpatrick, calls him the "warrior poet," and he and his wife help injured vets at Walter Reed through the Yellow Ribbon fund ([www.yellowribbonfund.org](http://www.yellowribbonfund.org)).

Ami Neiberger-Miller of Sterling lost her brother, U.S. Army Spc. Christopher Neiberger, in August 2007 when he was killed by a roadside bomb in Iraq. He was 22. Since her brother's death, Neiberger-Miller has devoted herself to the Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors ([www.taps.org](http://www.taps.org)), an amazing organization which provides emotional support and other services for families of the fallen. This Memorial Day weekend, TAPS will bring together survivors in Arlington for the 18th National Military Survivor seminar, along with a "good grief" camp for children who have lost a parent.

Staff Sgt. Jesse G. Clowers Jr., 27, of Herndon, died when an improvised bomb exploded near his vehicle in Afghanistan on Aug. 12, 2007. Jonathan D. Winterbottom, 21, of Falls Church, died in Iraq on May 23, 2007, when an IED exploded near his vehicle.

Nicholas Rapavi, 22, of Springfield, died Nov. 24, 2006, during combat in Anbar province in Iraq. Army Cpl. Andy D. Anderson, 24, was killed by enemy fire in Ar Ramadi, Iraq on Tuesday, June 6, 2006.

Airman 1st Class LeeBernard E. Chavis, 21, was killed Oct. 14, 2006, by sniper fire in Iraq, trying to protect civilians from a roadside bomb.

Spc. Robert Drawl Jr., 21, a 2003 graduate of T.C. Williams High School, was killed by a bomb in Kunar, Afghanistan, on Aug. 19, 2006.

Capt. Shane R. M. Mahaffee, 36, a 1987 graduate of Mount Vernon High School, died May 15, 2006. He was a lawyer, married, with two children. His parents live in Alexandria.

U.S. Marine Lance Cpl. Nicholas Kirven, 21, was killed in Afghanistan in 2005 during a firefight in a cave with insurgents. He enlisted while still in high school after 9/11. Maj. William F. Hecker III, a 1987 graduate of McLean High School, was killed in action in An Najaf, Iraq, Jan. 5, 2005. Staff Sgt. Ayman Taha, 31, of Vienna, was killed Dec. 30, 2005, when an enemy munitions cache he was prepping for demolition exploded. Army Capt. Chris Petty of Vienna was killed Jan. 5, 2006.

Staff Sgt. George T. Alexander Jr., the 2,000th soldier to be killed in Iraq, was literally born into the Army here in Northern Virginia, at DeWitt Army Hospital at Fort Belvoir. Alexander died at Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio, Texas, Oct. 22, 2005, of injuries sustained in Samarra, Iraq, Oct. 17, 2005.

Lt. Col. Thomas A. Wren, 44, of Lorton, died in Tallil, Iraq on Nov. 5, 2005. Marine Capt. Michael Martino, 32 of the City of Fairfax, died Nov. 2, 2005, when his helicopter was brought down in Iraq.

1st Lt. Laura M. Walker of Oakton was killed on Aug. 18, 2005, in Kandahar, Afghanistan. CW4 Matthew S. Lourey of Lorton died from injuries sustained on May 26, 2005 in Buhriz, Iraq.

Operations Officer Helge Boes of Fairfax was killed on Feb. 5, 2003, while participating in counterterrorism efforts in eastern Afghanistan.

# Recognition is Given for Play’s Premiere

## Robinson receives 10 Cappie nominations.

In November 2011, Robinson Secondary had the honor of performing the world premiere of an original play, Ken Ludwig’s “Midsummer/Jersey.” And now, that play has received 10 Cappie nominations for excellence in high-school theater.

It’s a mash-up of Shakespeare’s “Midsummer Night’s Dream” and MTV’s “Jersey Shore.” Using modern language, it follows Shakespeare’s story, but sets it in contemporary New Jersey.

Four “Guido” and “Guidette” teens in love are on a beach near where hairdressers are rehearsing the play, “Romeo and Juliet.” Also there are two groups of feuding and magical fairies. When fairy Puck meddles in the lives of both the lovers and the actors, mad mix-ups and hilarity ensue.

A hit with both audiences and the Cappie critics, the show garnered nominations for: Best Play, Supporting Actor in a Play, Dan Barr; Comic Actor in a Play, Adam Bradley; Comic Actress in a Play, Carys Meyer; Featured Actor in a Play, Jamie Green; Ensemble in a Play, The Mechanicals (hairdressers); Creativity in Musicianship, Oberon’s Crew; Makeup, Kayla Neal and Crew; Sets, Matt Lynch, Lindsey Rubin, Emily Rowson and Hannah Sikora; and Sound, Chris Mayhew and Christine Wagner.

“It doesn’t mean we’re going to win anything,” said Director Chip Rome. “But it’s very exciting to be recognized by our colleagues and by other students across the region as a school that does excellent work. There are a lot of talented kids out there, and we’re delighted to be among those getting a pat on the back – but many deserve it.”

**THE NOMINATION** he wanted most is for Best Play because it

means his thespians will perform a scene at The Kennedy Center Gala, June 10, when the award winners are announced. “It’s a great honor to be nominated as among the five best plays from such an impressive array of shows,” he said.

Besides the acting nods, Rome’s also pleased about the tech nominations. In acting, Robinson just competed against those schools performing plays, not musicals. But in tech categories, it vied against all the nearly 60 schools participat-

skateboarding to gymnastics. Both he and Dan put in the kind of effort required to create something new, based on something familiar.”

Nominated for Creativity in Musicianship is Oberon’s Crew of male fairies. “We added them into the script, and the students created music for all the magical moments and effects that Oberon and Puck throw at the various characters,” said Rome. “The actors used a cello, violin, piano and a thunder sheet to create the sound of fairy magic.”

“To me, the play is about love and that you’re complete when you find your other half,” he explained. “Titania’s fairies needed male counterparts, and the last moments of the play have nearly everyone paired up.”

Rome said Meyer had the role everyone wanted – the over-enthusiastic hairdresser who wants to act all the roles in the play within the play. And, added the director, “She’s the one Puck transforms into the head of an ass – with whom Titania falls in love. This character is also from the Jersey Shore, so she has to do the dialect, enthusiastic hamming-it-up and singing badly on purpose inside a papier-mâché head. Carys is very talented and also a dream to work with.”

He also called Jamie Green a wonderful actor who throws himself fully into each project. “He hammed it up appropriately for his role of Robert, the hairdresser,” said Rome. “And he was the wall in the play within the play.”

Nominated for Best Ensemble are the Hair and Gone hairdressers, who are also putting on a play. There’s such variety in this cluster of six people, said Rome, that they were “tremendously fun to watch.”

The sound nod was for “bringing power and echo to Oberon’s voice when he got angry,” said the director. “We also used a lot of the stage, so we hid wireless floor mikes in the different levels of the set. And we had to have lots of perfectly timed sound effects.”

ously throughout the day, on just four gallons of gas.

“This train never goes out of style,” said Reagle, who estimates about 90,000 people ride the train each year.

“We love riding the train,” said Meredith Materka of Burke, who rode with her son Nico, 2 1/2. “It’s an annual rite to come here, ride the train and the carousel and then get some ice-cream.”

Mason Keeney, 3, who was riding the train with his mom, Stephanie, and dad Cody, said he wanted to ride the train “at least two times, and get some ice-cream.”

The train takes riders over 1.75 miles of track in about 10 minutes and reaches speeds of 10 to 12 miles per hour.

After the chug-along, there’s more old-fashioned fun - a spin

on the carousel, a hand-dipped cone at the Ice Cream Parlor and a walk on the park trail rated one of the 10 best urban fitness trails in the nation by the American Hiking Society.

The miniature train track, which runs parallel to the shoreline of Burke Lake, passes through a small tunnel, crosses 11 drainage culverts, and a wooden trestle. Renovations included replacing existing ties, rails, and switches, reconstructing the stone base and replacing the culvert pipes. Approximately 1,500 linear feet of wooden retaining wall was also replaced, according to park officials.

The 2008 Park Bond provided funding specifically for this project, which cost approximately \$897,000. Work was completed by general contractor Southern Asphalt Company, Inc. of Lorton.

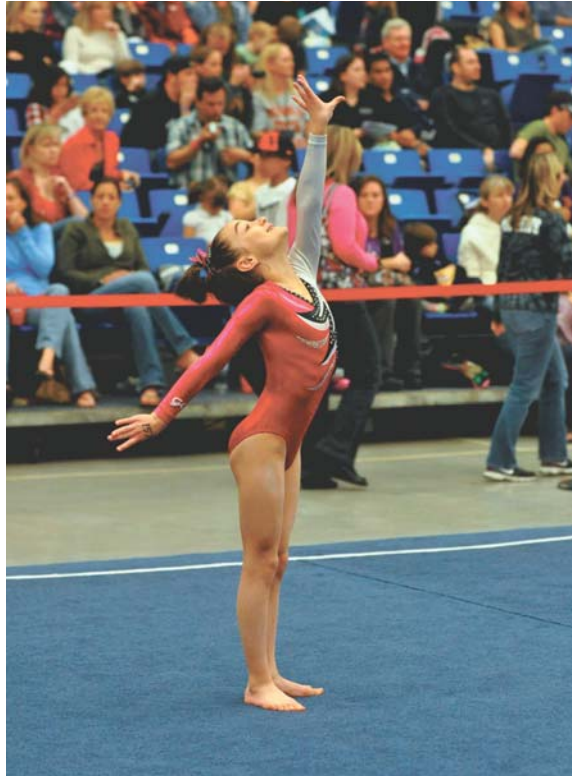

# Lake Braddock Baseball Wins Patriot District

**Bruins beat West Springfield for second title in three years.**

**W**hile Lake Braddock coaches and players hung out on the South County baseball field after the Patriot District tournament final, center fielder Alex Gransback and catcher Garrett Driscoll snuck into the third-base dugout in search of a water bucket.

After acquiring the container, the duo headed back onto the field with the intention of soaking head coach Jody Rutherford with a celebratory shower. Gransback walked up and hugged Rutherford as an attempted distraction, hoping Driscoll would work his way behind the coach before

emptying the bucket’s contents. Instead, Driscoll walked up behind Gransback and dumped the water, leaving his teammate to take the brunt of the aqua assault while Rutherford escaped relatively unscathed.

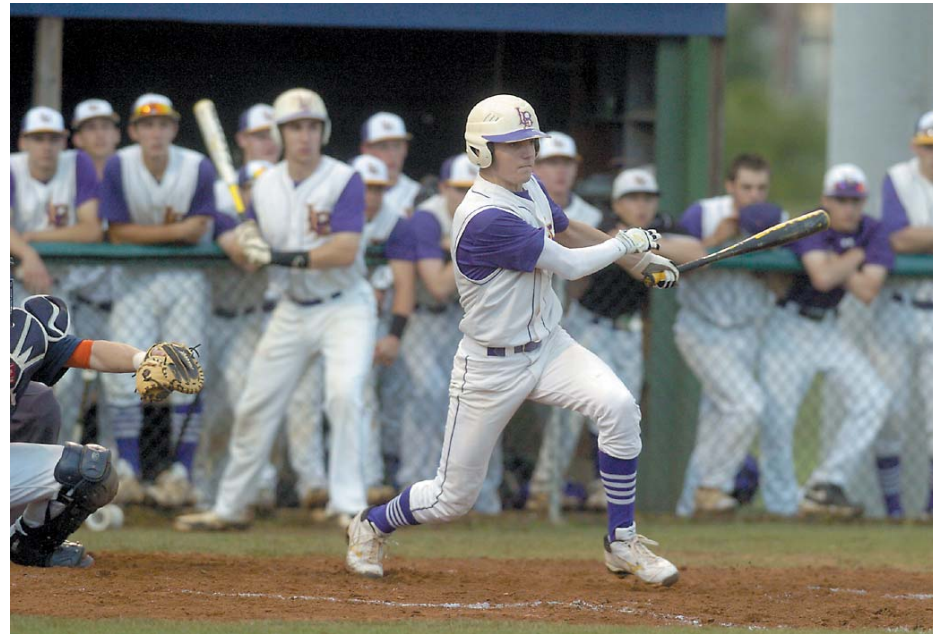
“Poor technique,” the coach said.

While their execution of post-game antics left something to be desired, the Bruins’ in-game performance against West Springfield

was far more effective.

The Lake Braddock baseball team pounded 10 hits and played solid defense behind starting pitcher Michael Church en route to a 7-2 victory against West Springfield on May 21 in the Patriot District championship game. The Bruins captured their second district title in three years, improved their record to 20-2 and secured the district’s top seed heading into the Northern Region tournament.

Lake Braddock reached the state tournament last season and is ranked No. 1 in the Washington Post’s top 10 poll. However, the Bruins aren’t going to let high expectations keep them from enjoying success in the early stages of what could be a deep postseason run.

“You’ve got to get them one by one,” senior left fielder Dylan O'Connor said. “This is what we look forward to. We haven’t looked past a district championship at all. This is what we wanted to win first and luckily we’ve got this, now we can move onto the region.”

Rutherford echoed the senior’s statement. “We’re going to take the time to enjoy this,” the coach said. “It’s harder when you’re expected to win. It’s a little bit more of a grind; it’s a little bit more pressure on you. That part of it is tough, but we’re definitely going to enjoy it. We definitely have plans for winning more games, but we’ll take time to enjoy this because you never know how many more games we’ll play this year.”

O'Connor went 2 for 3 against West Springfield, including a two-run double in the fourth inning. In left field, O'Connor made a trio of fine catches in the late innings.

Lake Braddock led 6-1 in the sixth inning when West Springfield shortstop Taylor Boyd hit a deep fly ball with one on and nobody out. O'Connor went back and made an acrobatic catch near the fence. The following batter, center fielder Nick Stevens, hit a fly ball that O'Connor chased down in foul territory.

In the bottom of the seventh, O'Connor ended the game with another catch on near the fence.

“[O'Connor] had a really, really good basketball season. I was hoping when he came out this year that that would kind of carry over to the baseball field and it really has,” Rutherford said. “Tonight, [he had a] big game. He wanted to take charge and be a leader. It was a great game for him. We’ve had confidence with him. He does a lot of things for us — a lot of small things that don’t show up in the stats. He’s been invaluable for us.”

Second baseman Matt Spruill got Lake

West Springfield, they did a great job. That’s the best he’s been hit all year. Some of the credit has to go to them and their approach at the plate.”

Trailing 3-0, West Springfield strung together three consecutive two-out hits in the third inning, but a solid play by the Lake Braddock defense held the Spartans to just one run. After back-to-back singles by pitcher Frank Sturek and Boyd, Stevens doubled in a run. But on the play, center fielder Gransback picked up ball, hit the cutoff man, shortstop Jack Owens, who threw home to cut down Boyd at the plate for the third out of the inning.

In the fifth inning, West Springfield third baseman Ryan Smith hit a fly ball to left with home-run distance, but it sailed foul. Later in the at-bat, he flew out to deep center.

Catcher Donny Haeuptle went 2 for 3 with an RBI for the Spartans.

“I was proud of the way we played,” West Springfield head coach Jason Olms said.

Braddock on the board first, smacking a two-run home run to center field in the second inning. Designated hitter Nathan Parker delivered a run-scoring single in the second and Gransback drove in a run with a sacrifice fly in the fourth. The Bruins’ seventh run scored on a West Springfield wild pitch in the sixth.

Church, the co-Patriot District Pitcher of the Year, earned the victory with a complete-game effort on the mound. He allowed two runs — one earned — and eight hits in seven innings while walking one and striking out five. He threw 61 of 101 pitches for strikes and held the Spartan lineup to one earned run despite throwing a first-pitch strike to 11 of 27 batters.

“It wasn’t by any means his best effort, physically,” Rutherford said. “Mentally, he was tough as he always is. Physically, he struggled with command early in the count.

Lake Braddock had six players named first-team all-district: Spruill; Owens; third baseman Alex Lewis; Gransback; pitcher Thomas Rogers and Church. Rogers and Church were named co-Pitchers of the Year and Rutherford received Coach of the Year honors.

Haeuptle and pitcher Connor Tagg received first-team accolades for West Springfield.

Lake Braddock will host Wakefield, the No. 4 seed from the National District, at 7 p.m. on Friday, May 25. West Springfield will host Washington-Lee, the National District’s No. 3 seed.

“District championships are awesome for us,” Church said. “It’s just one step closer to a state championship.”

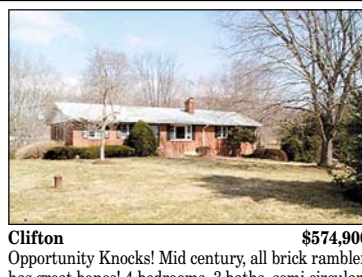
