

## Spring Fun Crystal City 5k runs return in April

**S**ay goodbye to winter woes over a friendly 5k run this April in Crystal City. Races return this spring every Friday, and offer participants a chance to get out and go.

"I believe anyone can train for a 5k," said Terrill Jefferies, a physical trainer and group

running coach. "Out of all the races, the 5k is the most scatterbrained of them all. There are people who just want to do a 5k a day to keep the doctor away, there's the track and field athlete who practically sprints the entire distance, and there's everybody in between."

The Friday evening spring races draw crowds from across the region. According to event organizers the 5k races host 1,500 run-

ners on average, and the relaxed atmosphere creates a sense of community and fun.

"The races are one of our most successful events in a lot of ways, they showcase a neighborhood in a fun way," said Angela Fox, president and CEO of the Crystal City BID. "If you've never run a 5k and always wanted to, here's a chance to run on a flat course over four weeks. The races have a laid back attitude, people are mostly competing with themselves, there's a nice feel to it."

Abundant parking, bicycle stops, and the nearby Crystal City metro station make getting to the race easy and convenient. Bag checks are available at the starting line, and post race festivities include an after party at Hamburger Hamlet where racers can digest their accomplishments.

"It's a great environment, especially for people just getting started, you get to go at your own pace," said Allison Logemann, an Arlington resident who participated in last year's race. "I really enjoyed it last year, I'm looking forward to doing it again."



## Moving the Boundaries Arlington school officials to conduct public hearings on changes to attendance zones

**A**rlington County schools are bursting at the seams, with schools at or beyond capacity across the division. With enrollment projections showing no sign of letting up, school officials are going back to the drawing board — literally — drawing a new boundary map. The politics of which neighborhoods are assigned to which schools can be divisive, tearing communities apart pitting neighbors against each other in pitched boundary wars. Arlington County school leaders hope to avoid conflict by holding a series of public forums leading up to the final vote, which is expected this spring.

"This is going to be the first stage in addressing this issue over a series of years," said Superintendent Patrick Murphy. "We've had to do this in a matter that is strategic and comprehensive."

School leaders usually try to avoid drawing new boundaries because of intense neighborhood feelings. But Arlington leaders had no choice because a new elementary school will be opening its doors soon near Williamsburg Middle School in the fall

of 2015. Administrators are also dealing with overcrowded classrooms at seven elementary schools: Ashlawn, Glebe, Jamestown, McKinley, Nottingham, Taylor, and Tuckahoe. Critics say Arlington Public Schools is segregating wealthy white children in north Arlington and poor minority children in the south part of the county.

"The board's defensive mantra is that if they do not overtly intend to segregate, it cannot be called segregation," said Fred Millar, whose children attend Arlington Public Schools. "We parent activists have been challenging them on this all along the process, pointing out that de jure and de facto segregation must be distinguished."

**THE DIALOGUE** began in September 2011, when the superintendent launched a campaign he calls "More Seats for More Students." In October of last year, School Board members approved a scope for the process. For the next several months, various options were considered by school officials, parents and students. School Board member Sally Baird said school officials were eager to avoid the controversy that gripped the county back in 2007, when



### Current Proposed Design of the Millennium Project

The Millennium expansion project is estimated to add close to 30,000 additional burial and niche spaces to Arlington National Cemetery. The current design includes restoring the existing stream and preserving the trees within 50-to-100 feet of the creek, as well as other areas where possible. The Millennium Project at Arlington National Cemetery started in the late 1990s when the Arlington National Cemetery was near capacity. Expansion areas were limited, but through law, Congress directed a land transfer from Joint Base Myer-Henderson Hall and the National Park Service; paired with existing Arlington property, the Millennium Project was born.

administrators drew the last set of boundary changes.

“It was kind of difficult and not pretty and contentious and really divisive for the community,” said Baird. “That was really difficult, and not something that we wanted to do again.”

School officials say their top priority was proximity — keeping students as close to their home as possible. They also wanted to make sure that the boundary changes preserved as much stability as possible, minimizing the number of students who have been assigned to new schools. The trick was to accomplish this while minimizing the separation of students from their classmates and while promoting demographic diversity. Ultimately, the superintendent recommended a plan that moved the fewest number of students as possible.

“This plan is effective at relieving overcrowding as well as balancing capacity,” said Lionel White, director of facilities and planning.

**DEMOGRAPHIC DATA** from the school system shows that schools in the south part of the county tend to have higher rates of poverty, including Carlin Springs Elementary, Randolph Elementary and

Hoffman-Boston Elementary. Schools on the north end, on the other hand, have the lowest rates of poverty, including Tuckahoe Elementary, Nottingham Elementary and Taylor Elementary. That disparity concerns many parents.

“Socio-economic as well as racial and ethnic integration should be a fundamental principle for the organization of public education,” said Jim Lyons, a civil rights attorney in Arlington. “I don’t think we want to construct a school system on the basis of residential patterns that are either economic or racial and ethnic segregation.”

For now, a set of boundary changes largely preserves the current map — with the exception of adding a new elementary school in north Arlington. School officials don’t have a name for the new facility yet, although they expect to have one before it opens in 2014.

“This is a tremendous opportunity because we are building a brand new, beautiful elementary school,” said School Board member Abby Raphael. “And one of the primary reasons we are doing this now is so that we create the community at that school, and families can be part of the decisions that are going to be made about that school.”

# Operation Patriotic STEM

Marymount University makes science fun at Ft. Belvoir Elementary School.

**A**s stomp rockets flew through the air, balloons expanded, and electricity set hair standing on end, children at Ft. Belvoir Elementary School didn't know which hands-on science activity to try first.

They were participating in Operation Patriotic STEM, an evening of science activities organized by Marymount University. Dr. Usha Rajdev, Marymount associate professor of Education, has established a partnership with the Ft. Belvoir school to "give back to U.S. military families who sacrifice so much for us."

For the evening's activities, she brought in educational partners Rick Varner from NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center, Elizabeth Burke from Project Learning Tree, and Tammy Maxey from Agriculture in the Classroom.

Marymount master of education candidates and undergraduates studying to become elementary school teachers were joined by students in Dr. Eric Bubar's physical science course staffed the hands-on activities, which included creating lightning and static electricity with van

de graaf generators; viewing Jupiter and the moon through a telescope; papermaking; stringing earth-bead bracelets; making and launching stomp rockets; learning about covalent bonds by using milk, food coloring and soap; playing a resource-matching game; making seed buddies that use body heat to help seeds germinate; and inflating balloons with baking soda and carbon dioxide.

Next year, the partnership with Ft. Belvoir will expand. Undergraduates in the Teaching Mathematics and Science course will spend Wednesdays at Ft. Belvoir. In the mornings, they will learn a hands-on math lesson, then immediately teach it to a class at the school. In the afternoon, they will do the same with a science lesson.

## 'Voodoo Macbeth'

American Century stages dark Orson Welles drama.

William Shakespeare's "Macbeth," considered by many to be one of his darkest tragedies, tells the story of a Scottish general named Macbeth who commits murder to become king and fulfill his ambition for power. In 1936, a young Orson Welles staged his own legendary adaptation of the play, "Voodoo Macbeth," which is reimaged now by The American Century Theater.

Directed by Kathleen Akerley, TACT's production diverges from Welles' original staging and casting concepts, which moved the setting to Haiti and replaced



Matt Dewberry as Gruoch and Joe Carlson as Macbeth.

Shakespeare's original themes of witchcraft and the occult with practices of voodoo.

Using an all-male cast, Akerley returns "Voodoo Macbeth" to Scotland, where a battalion of American servicemen is stationed in the futuristic year 2033. Their Christian faith is combined with Wiccan-like practices to depict the story of Macbeth's murder of King Duncan and subsequent tyrannical rule.

Joe Carlson is compelling as Macbeth with the talented Matt Dewberry joining him as Gruoch, Macbeth's closet confidant and Akerley's replacement of the traditional Lady Macbeth role.

Other performers in the ensemble cast include Frank Britton as Banquo, Theodore M. Snead as Duncan, William Hayes as Hecate, and James Miller as Ross.

Akerley is joined by the talented production team of Tyler Hermann and Annalisa Dias-Mandoly (assistant directors), Frank DiSalvo Jr. (sound design), Jason Aufdem-Brinke (lighting design), and Casey Kaleba (choreography). Akerley herself is behind the appropriately eerie

set and costume designs.

Although TACT is known for its revivals of often overlooked American plays, this production of "Voodoo Macbeth" is more a tribute to Welles' creative style rather than a traditional re-staging of his script. In that regard, Jack Marshall's Artistic Director's Notes in the program book are a must-read to make sense of this unconventional story line so allow a few extra minutes prior to the show to gain a better understanding of Akerley's complex vision.

With its blood, gore and occult influences,

"Voodoo Macbeth" is not for everyone and TACT's adaptation in particular is geared towards an audience with a heightened appreciation for Welles' groundbreaking interpretation of Shakespeare's tragic tale.





## 14.8 Percent

That is the percentage of diagnosed lung cancer patients who survive beyond five years, according to The National Cancer Institute's SEER Cancer Statistics Review, 1975-2009, in a graph published in the February 26, 2013 Washington Post's weekly Health & Science section. As a non-small cell lung cancer (NSCLC) survivor beginning his fifth year post-diagnosis, charting my prospects in such a cold and impersonal manner is both chilling and arguable. "Chilling" in that facts speak for themselves and are hardly made up of whole cloth, to invoke one of the late Jack Kent Cooke's more famous quotes. And "arguable" in that charts, statistics, etc. may very well measure the mean, but it sure doesn't measure the man (this man, anyway). Meaning, from my perspective: sure, the chart is scary as hell, but I'm not sure I'm on it, if you know what I mean? (I know you know what I hope.)

Now whether you believe it or not matters not to me, rather what I believe matters most. And I believe in the individuality of individuals and of the immeasurable characteristics that don't show up on two-dimensional graphs. Since I live in a three-dimensional world, I'm loathe – and quite hesitant, to think that I'm just another terminal patient/number. Now, I don't dismiss such statistics out of hand, obviously, but nor do I take them to heart to determine how I intend on living my life. Certainly I'm not going to ignore them; I'm not a blockhead. But neither do I expect them to affect my thinking, my judgment, my preparation and my attitude. I still believe anything is possible and I'd like to think – and continue to think: "I've lived this long. Certainly I can live a little bit longer" (updated daily).

I have to admit though, that reading articles and seeing charts which offer improving but still extremely discouraging life expectancies, particularly for lung cancer patients (12.3 percent was the previous five-year survival rate, the lowest for all cancers charted in this particular graph) doesn't exactly make my day – or night, for that matter. Somehow, I have to find a way to disassociate myself from that population despite being immersed in its culture every minute of every day. Which when you consider that I have my oncologist's phone number programmed on my speed dial and that the chemotherapy-induced neuropathy in my feet offers constant reminders that I'm not in Kansas anymore (if I were in Kansas, I'm sure the neuropathy would be just as bad), the likelihood of my not feeling the effects of my diagnosis, physical, mental or emotional is somewhere between slim and none. Coping is what it's all about and not taking anything too personally, even though this is all very personal. And though I am keenly aware of my circumstances – as most of you regular readers are, finding a way to not let it define me and/or control me totally, is the challenge with which I am most familiar.

As Popeye the Sailor Man so famously said: "I yam what I yam." And so am I. I'm Kenny-with-cancer. So what else is new?


