



I then catch a glimpse of a man. I see only the back of him, but I know who he is. He is looking for something. I look at his hat and it has a very familiar name on it: "BALLOU." I run to the soldier and tap on his shoulder. He turns around. His face lights up and he picks me up. I take in everything about Dad: his Old Spice cologne, the familiar roughness of his uniform, and his hugging arms.

"Katie," his voice shakes and I smile because I know that dad will never leave again.


### The Last Swing


